Keeping LAMS courses in prime time is essential for the survival of the program, given that the number of sections is limited (and all but one of our courses is offered only once a year). This prime-time schedule preference is justified as the curriculum aligns with Langara's priorities for Inclusion and Diversity; indigenous education; and Internationalization.	External Review, page 6	If we were forced to run a Latin American Studies course outside prime time we predict that numbers would be extremely low and the course may risk being cancelled. It does not make sense for courses that run once or twice a year be forced into unpopular time-slots; such courses should be exempt from the 10% rule. Only courses that have multiple sections a semester should meet the 10% rule. We fear that our students will struggle to obtain their credentials if our courses are moved out of prime time.
