The <u>Department of Art History and Religious Studies</u> offers a <u>Certificate in Art History</u> that is intended for students from all disciplines who are interested in developing visual literacy - an indispensable skill that enables students to recognize, interpret and appreciate meaning in an image-saturated world.

The department also offers support courses in Art History and Religious Studies for several Langara programs. The courses the department offers carry university transfer credit and are a major component of arts, humanities and other specialized degrees.
