Education Assistant

Department Overview

The Education Assistant Department launched in 1967 to prepare non-teachers to do educationally related work in schools. The department offers a <u>Certificate in Early Childhood Education</u> which can be completed full-time in one-year/three semesters, or part-time in two years. Students may receive a Coordinated Diploma if they earn an additional 30 university transferable credits outside of the Certificate.
