Langara's <u>Peace and Conflict Studies</u> (PCCN) is an interdisciplinary field of study which is concerned with the problem of human conflict, and how it can be constructively and non-violently resolved. Its interdisciplinary approach to analysis draws on the perspectives of the physical and social sciences, history and philosophy. The department offers a <u>Diploma</u>, which adds to an understanding of these most complex and pressing human issues, as well as a university transferrable <u>Associate of Arts degree</u>.
