4a) COMPUTING SCIENCE & INFORMATION SYSTEMS

Program Revision

i) Associate of Science Degree

(Area of Concentration: Computer Science) or (Area of Concentration: Computer Science, Cooperative Education)

M. Heldman spoke to this topic. She introduced F. Parvaz, Chair of the Computing Science and Information Systems department, and N. Wijesinghe, Coordinator for Academic Affairs (CSIS department), who have worked hard to bring the new programs forward for the Council's consideration. The process began in December 2003 with the formation of the Computer Studies Strategic Planning Committee. The first CSIS advisory committee meeting was held last week.

Referencing p. 9 to 14 of the agenda package, M. Heldman indicated that the existing Associate of Science Degree has been revised to offer students the option to choose either the regular stream (with a concentration in Computer Science) or the co-op stream (with a concentration in Computer Science). This is the first university transfer co-op Associate of Science Degree at the College. Students undertaking to study for this credential will be able to smoothly transfer to UBC, SFU or UVic.

4a) COMPUTING SCIENCE & INFORMATION SYSTEMS (cont'd)

M. Heldman presented the Management Information Systems (MIS) Diploma as a package referencing p. 15 to 72 of the agenda package.

The MIS Diploma is a two-year diploma program offering a co-op option with two work terms. This is a business focused program, the result of feedback gathered from an employer survey and student focus groups. Both these initiatives identified the need to prepare graduates for the job market and include preparation of soft skills. The seven proposed courses outlined on p. 23 to 64 are required courses in the MIS Diploma, including four computing science & information courses, and three computer science courses. The change to course prerequisites and the minor course revision, as described on p. 65 to 72, were also presented for approval at this meeting.

L. Arnold suggested this would be an appropriate opportunity to acknowledge the diligence and significant commitment of the faculty members in the Computing Science and Information Systems department in putting together these program proposals for consideration by Education Council.

The Display + Design department proposed dividing each core course into a two-credit theory course and a one-credit studio course as outlined on p. 77 of the agenda package. A similar pattern will apply to all four terms in the program. It was further suggested that MARK 2350 in Term 3 be switched to Term 4; and BUSM 1115 in Term 4 be switched to Term 3. The renumbering of the courses in consultation with the Registrar's office was required.

6) Policy E2008 – Academic Standing – Academic Probation and Academic Suspension

P. Gallagher, on behalf of J. Hooton, presented the Policy E2008: Academic Standing – Academic Probation and Academic Suspension. This revised policy contained changes noted in bold and italics on p. 289 to 293 of the agenda package. The motion to approve this revised policy retroactive to November 19, 2003 was put forward to Education Council for consideration by Education Council.

Referencing p.292 of the agenda package, it was noted that *Appendix A* was missing from the policy. M. Gerson indicated this appendix will be put in place for September 2005. He suggested J. Hooton bring Appendix A, which is currently under development, to the next Education Council meeting. J. Hooton agreed to report back to the council members in June. It was suggested removing "Not applicable" from Item 10: Appendices on p. 293 of the agenda.
