ARCHITECTURAL PHOTOGRAPHY

Architectural photography introduces students to the very specialized genre of interior and exterior architectural photography. Aspects such as equipment selection, lighting, contemporary styles, and aesthetics, as well as the business side of the genre are all addressed. For the shooter that appreciates the beauty and challenge of photographs that adorn the pages of contemporary home-style magazines, this course is a must. Half of the classes will be field trips to shoot exteriors and interiors. Students will be able to use Canon or Nikon tilt/shift lenses in one class and lighting equipment in others. Students are asked to be a little flexible as to times for field trips to make best use of the light and accessibility to interiors. There will also be guest speakers.

Prerequisites: Advanced Studio Lighting/Photoshop Level I.
