- Supporting parolees at cultural events
- Completing research and development projects
- Acting as a liaison for offenders to support services
- Assisting offenders in accessing community resources

- Must be at least 19 years of age
- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- > Demonstrate knowledge of issues that impact marginalized populations
- Display proper boundaries and judgement
- > Able to maintain confidentiality

- Gain invaluable workplace experience
- Employment references

The Volunteer Program offers on-going opportunities for individuals who can commit a minimum of two hours per week, over a term of one year.
