Course Description

This course will examine the historical development of hip hop and its poetic form/conventions. Our studies will incorporate a wide spectrum of hip hop, from the violent class/race politics of gangsta rap and the misogynistic lyrics of club rap to the Afrocentric messages of early 90s hip hop and the socio-political commentary of contemporary conscious rap.
