I heard some pre-requisites for English & Communications courses have changed.

*Is ENGL 1107 a credit course?

ENGL is a preparatory course. It does not carry UT credit, and cannot be used towards program requirements. However, it does count towards full-time designation for immigration purposes. Also, a passing grade in ENGL 1107 is equivalent to LET 3, and can be used to meet the pre-requisites for most first-year CMNS and ENGL courses.

**What is CMNS 1114?

CMNS 1114 is a new course, which will be offered for the first time in September 2020. It is not ready to be offered for Summer 2020.

CMNS 1114 is similar to CMNS 1118; it can be taken at the same time as CMNS 1115, and students can earn credit for both courses. Like CMNS 1115, it has an IELTS 6.5 pre-requisite.

Do all programs accept CMNS 1114 and/or CMNS 1115 as "UT English"?

No. Students in General Education can use CMNS 1114 and 1115 to meet the English requirement. For all other programs, please check with a program advisor or with the Graduation Evaluation team (gradeval@langara.ca) to see if that program accepts CMNS 1114 and/or CMNS 1115.

The LET and LPI have been cancelled.

- When will the next LET or LPI take place? We don't know. We await guidance from provincial health authorities. Updates will be posted on the College website.
- Will the LET be offered online? No. The LET is not an online exam.
- Since there is no LET or LPI, are all pre-requisites removed? No. Pre-requisites remain in place for all courses; they are there to ensure that students have the skills they need to succeed in each course.
- But this is my last semester can't I just get overrides?
 No. Overrides are never given on the basis of a student's individual timeline or circumstances.
 They are only given when a student has met the pre-requisite in some way.
- If I can't take LET or LPI what should I do? Please see the table below for possible pathways, depending on the pre-requisites you have.
