LIBR 1111 : Information Literacy and Online Search

Course Format: Online through Brightspace

Course Description, Prerequisites, and Corequisites:

Students explore the concept of information literacy requiring them to recognize when information is needed, and how to locate, evaluate, use and teach others how to find information effectively.

In addition, this course will provide students with a module on intercultural communication with a focus on information literacy and online search through the Collaborative Online International Learning program.

1. communicate effectively and appropriately using email and social media in diverse library environments
2. apply appropriate intercultural communication strategies to respectfully communicate with partners during a group project through the Collaborative Online International Learning program
3. identify and use the information cycle in order to locate and evaluate resources
4. conduct successful searches for resources using effective search strategies and appropriate databases or other resources
5. find, evaluate and organize resources and use a content management system to present the information
6. cite and annotate information resources
7. teach search skills using library related resources

Methodology

- Unmarked activities, online discussions: students will be expected to interact with each other and the instructor in online discussions and complete activities weekly.
- Assignments: Several graded assignments will be assigned throughout the term.
- Major Project: Students will complete a project that demonstrates competence with technical skills as well as understanding of their application to the information and library environment.
