Course Description, Prerequisites, and Corequisites:

LIBR 2419 builds on previous courses in an exploration of the library and information field. In this course, the learner calls upon the knowledge, values and skills gained in the previous three terms to successfully complete 120 hours of field-work in one or more placements. At the end of the course, the student has knowledge and experience of a variety of workplaces and a range of common practices and routines in all aspects of library work.

Prerequisite: LIBR 1219 with an 'S', LIBR 2411

Corequisites(s): LIBR 2328, LIBR 2315, and LIBR 2416

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course, the learner will have acquired the knowledge, values and skills to be able to:

1. Demonstrate knowledge of a wide range of routines and practices. Develop and maintain a current skills/competencies checklist.
2. Demonstrate career/job readiness. Maintain a current resume, develop job search strategies and review interview skills. Students have the opportunity to participate in a brief mock interview and receive feedback.
3. Demonstrate successful work skills in one or more practicum placements. Successfully complete 120 hours of field work. Analyze field work experience by completing a self-evaluation of practicum experience.
