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Langara Library is at the heart of a vibrant, engaging and exciting educational experience, and is an essential contributor to academic excellence – a progressive academic library, fully integrated with the teaching, learning and research at Langara College.



Introductory message.

The overarching project this year was the Library's strategic visioning plan. This collaborative process joined students, faculty, administration, and Library employees in defining the future of the Library and its role at the College. Led by facilitators from Dysart & Jones, Library employees worked with Langara students, faculty, staff, and administrators to craft a shared vision of a progressive academic library, fully integrated with the teaching, learning, and research at the College and a vital contributor to the success of students and faculty.

The implementation of this strategic vision will transform the Library from a separate support service to an integral part of the College – its academic, social, and community life. Other significant projects completed in 2012/2013 include:

- Successfully migrating the Library's website into Langara's content management system and online tutorials onto the Desire2Learn (D2L) platform
- Renovation of the first floor to create the Learning Commons
- Developing and implementing a copyright business plan relevant to Langara
- Implementation of Sierra, Innovative Interface's next generation library services platform, after an active role as development partner.

Sharing unique expertise.


We help Langara students master the life skills and competencies necessary to thrive in the 21st century by strengthening the role of the Library as an academic partner with faculty, students, and employees.

TEACHING STUDENTS THROUGH D2L AND IN PERSON

After successfully converting our popular online tutorials from Blackboard to D2L, librarians evaluated the Library's instruction program and implemented the following improvements:

- Reaffirmed and reinvigorated collaboration with academic and other areas such as LEAP
- Developed and taught a series of "Citation Bootcamp" workshops in collaboration with the Writing Centre
- Created an online post-instruction survey to gather useful feedback for ongoing improvements
- Initiated a new online tutorial on avoiding plagiarism, available Fall 2013






CONTENT & RESOURCES

ACTIVE DEVELOPMENT PARTNER

The Langara Library, an active development partner for Innovative Interfaces' next generation Library Services Platform, successfully transitioned from Millennium to Sierra in August.

FIRST FLOOR COLLECTIONS


To ensure a highly used and relevant collection, the print reference and journal collections were evaluated with titles retained, withdrawn or relocated based on librarian and faculty recommendations, online availability and utility. Still on the first floor, the remaining print titles are on low shelving in the Reference section or in the Journals & Magazines Room, renovated to include extra study spaces.

COPYRIGHT


It has been an eventful year for Canadian copyright: copyright-related decisions from the Supreme Court of Canada were made, and on November 7, the *Copyright Modernization Act* came into force, adding several new users' rights for educators. While continuing to support the College's copyright needs, the Library:

- Formally presented the Copyright Business Plan to the College
- Created a Library Copyright Working Group
- Finalized three copyright policies and supplemental directives
- Established a generic email address (copyright@langara.bc.ca) to provide faculty and staff with access to information, consultation, and speedier responses to copyright queries
- Presented copyright workshops and drop-in sessions, with Library copyright experts on hand to discuss faculty and staff questions.

With students and faculty our primary consideration, we continue to improve our physical and virtual spaces.

INNOVATIVE ENVIRONMENTS FOR LEARNERS

The Library continues to engage with students, using an online presence (the Library's Facebook page) to reflect and augment in-person interactions:

- Live-action Angry Birds game during Welcome to Langara Day
- Open mic readings: love poems during Valentines Day, and challenged materials during Freedom to Read Week
- "De-Stress Fest" during final exams included an origami lounge, a social media haiku contest and free massage therapy offered by Langara's Continuing Studies Holistic Health Program
- "Blind Date with a Book" display encouraged students to check out an unknown novel or two
- Library employees embraced the Halloween spirit by dressing in costume and transforming the lobby into a mad scientists' laboratory (prize for Most Original Decorations)

Gothic fiction open mic at Halloween and Citation Bootcamp were two successful examples of the Library and Writing Centre working together. Close collaboration with Langara Design Formation and Fine Arts students resulted in colourful and dynamic displays throughout the year.



Learning commons.

Developed as a one-stop location for students to access enhanced learning support services and tools, the Learning Commons offers new technology-enhanced work areas, collaborative spaces, workshops, and research and tutoring help.


We've transformed the first floor to:

- Create a new home for the Writing Centre and academic peer tutors from Chemistry, Computer Science and Accounting
- Expand flexible, technology-enhanced group and solo study spaces throughout the first floor, including the addition of several smart tables
- Include a welcoming entrance sign with new magazine display and improved displays for graphic novels, and ESL collections

Resulting in:

- · Academic tutoring partnership grows to six with more coming.
- Visits to Writing & Tutoring Centre grows [stats by term for tutoring, year compare for Writing Centre]

Note: Areas presented here are part of a pilot program to include academic tutors within the Library space. We look forward to having other academic tutoring services joining us in the future.





Community connections.

Our success depends on our ongoing relationship and ongoing communication with all of our communities of interest—the college, other post-secondary institutions, our industry, and Vancouver residents.

MEANINGFUL RELATIONSHIPS

Formed for Langara employees, Library Central (iweb.langara.bc.ca/ librarycentral) was reinvigorated to act as a vehicle to link to items of current awareness, highlight new resources, and share Library accomplishments.

Library employees continue to learn from and share with colleagues across BC, hosting professional meetings such as:

- Cataloguing with Resource Description and Access (RDA) workshop, sponsored by BC Cataloguing and Technical Services (BCCATS) Interest Group;
- Academic Librarians in Public Service (ALPS) Annual General Meeting, which focused on service reviews and assessment;

This year the Library hosted practicum student Sally Hao (Langara Library Technician Program) and professional experience student Alicia Arding (UBC iSchool).


