This year we initiated major projects that impacted all areas of the Library, and started regularly reporting out our successes and priorities to help keep the College community engaged and informed.

Our Library Director left Langara in January, and with the ongoing evolution in the post-secondary landscape, we chose to pause and evaluate. I took on additional responsibilities and we began a strategic visioning process to investigate how to best meet the evolving needs of our community. By the end of this process—which ends in March 2013—we will have clearly articulated our strategic vision for the Library, which will help direct the development of Langara as a leader in higher education in British Columbia.

# Communicating and sharing.

Communications Librarian Annie Jensen promotes the Library and its services to the Langara community. This new position liaises directly with the Langara Communications and Marketing Department, a partnership which vastly expanded the Library's audience for events and announcements, and streamlined our branding and marketing efforts.

The Library's communications plan for this year focused on improving the Library's social media presence. Annie oversaw our foursquare site, monitored Twitter for discussion of the Library, and successfully overhauled our Facebook page, where our followers have more than doubled and our weekly total reach hit over 8,000 people.

# CREATIVELY CONNECTING WITH STUDENTS:


- Experiential learning opportunities for Langara's Library Technician program students through job-shadowing, group interviews, and guest lectures



An aging print collection, evolving formats, and an increased demand for study space and electronic resources strongly impacted our collection this year. Some highlights:

# **Evolving content.**

### **ONGOING COLLECTION MAINTENANCE**

The Library continues to provide resources for all Langara departments, and the majority of our collection supports multidisciplinary study. However, adequate funding and meeting the practical needs of Langara learners continues to be a challenge. To ensure our collection is as useful as possible, in consultation with faculty and usage statistics, this year we evaluated and weeded our print journals, second floor books (call numbers A-F) and reference collection. As a result, we made room for 1,138 new titles and are in a better position to introduce new collaborative workspaces for students.

### E-BOOKS


After positive multi-departmental feedback on our Safari Books Online trial, we subscribed to the popular e-book collection using Library Foundation Funds.

We also tested a new purchasing model for ebooks (Patron Driven Acquisition). This successful pilot project allows students' actual use of materials to determine what we purchase for our collection.


### **MEDIA**


Susan Weber took on all Media Librarian roles in September. In consultation with faculty and usage statistics, she started weeding our media collection, donating low-use VHS tapes and 16mm films. Our slide image collection was also discarded in favour of more extensive licensed digital alternatives. The Library still maintains some higher-use VHS and some collection of 16mm film titles upon faculty request. Through subscriptions and purchasing individual titles, our media collection now has over 1,400 streaming videos.

# Developing technology for easier access.

An accessible collection requires a modern, robust library services platform at the back end; the best search and discovery tools possible available to front-end users; and a website that is comprehensive, attractive, and intuitive to use. To support this, we initiated several major projects:

- Became a partner with Innovative Interfaces, Inc. on the development of their next-generation library services platform, Sierra.
- Compared our current discovery tools against other products on the market to determine which best suits the Langara environment.
- Worked with Communications & Marketing to develop a new website within the College's content management system that is userfriendly and consistent with the Langara brand.
- Introduced SMS text messaging as quick reference tool and courtesy notice service. The number of questions received via SMS increased 80% between the fall and spring terms.


