



Tsleil-waututh First Nations












- Why is this important for us to know and learn?



Study Permit Compliance

As a study permit holder, you must:

- Be enrolled at a designated learning institution (DLI)
- Show you're actively pursuing your studies by:
 - Being enrolled full-time or part-time during each academic semester (excluding regularly scheduled breaks)
 - Making progress towards completing your program's courses, and
 - Not taking authorized leaves longer than
 150 days from your study program

- Apply to extend your study permit to change postsecondary schools
- End your studies if you no longer meet the requirements of being a student, and
- Leave Canada when your study permit expires

Study Permit Compliance

As a study permit holder, you must:

- Ensure that your study permit is valid for the entire length of your program
- You may apply to extend your study permit
 - Extending your study permit at least 3-4 months before it expires
- If your passport will expire while you are in Canada, apply to extend it or get a new one at least 6 months before it expires

Your application for an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) has been approved. You are now authorized to travel to Canada by air.

When you travel to Canada, you will need to bring the passport you used to apply for your eTA, as the eTA is electronically linked to it. Should you obtain a new passport, you will need to apply for a new eTA Airline check-in staff and the Canada Border Services Agency will have electronic access to your eTA status using your passport.

In the future, you can verify the status and expiration of your eTA by using the eTA Check Status Tool. To do this, you will need the eTA number noted above and details from the passport you used to apply for your eTA.

For information on what to see and do in Canada, visit www.Canada.travel. See you in Canada! Do you plan on visiting the United States? You may require authorization through the Electronic Syste for Travel Authorization (ESTA). Find out more on the ESTA website.

Working in Canada

International students may work off-campus without a work permit. If they:

- Have a valid study permit with a condition that allows students to take up employment
- Are a full-time student at a Designated Learning institution (DLI)
- Have started studying
- Are in a program that leads to a degree, diploma or certificate and is at least six months long; and
- Have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- ❖ Full-time status for Continuing Studies students is a minimum of 12 hours of instruction per week for 12 weeks

Working in Canada

How many hours can you work?

- No more than 24 hours per week while studying full-time
- Part-time students <u>cannot</u> work off-campus
- Students on scheduled break or who meet IRCC's temporary measure can work full-time

Remember: Studying is your top priority!

Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP)

WORK IN CANADA AFTER YOU GRADUATE

- To be eligible, you must meet all eligibility requirements:
 - General eligibility
 - Eligibility requirements based on study program
 - Graduates from a college program or other non-university program
 - Language requirement: CLB 5 for English or NCLC 5 for French
 - Eligibility requirements based on physical location
 - Inside or outside of Canada
 - Field of study requirements (if applicable)
 - Avoid changing your programs





Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP)

WORK IN CANADA AFTER YOU GRADUATE

- General Eligibility:
 - Completion of an eligible program that is at least 8 months in duration leading to a degree, diploma or certificate at DLI
 - You maintained full-time status as a student in Canada during each semester of your study program
 - Received a transcript and an official letter from Langara confirming that you have met the requirements to complete their program of study





Social Insurance Number (SIN)

- It is a 9-digit number that you need to work in Canada or to have access to government programs and benefits

Health Care in BC: Public & Private Insurance

- BC Medical Services Plan (MSP) \$75/month
- To apply, you need:
 - Copy of your study permit
 - BC residential address

- Waiting period for MSP: 3 months
- Apply for MSP online: https://my.gov.bc.ca/ahdc/msp-eligibility

BC Medical Services Plan (MSP)

Health Care in BC: Public & Private Insurance

- Enroll into a temporary medical insurance plan (e.g. guard.me) to cover the waiting period for MSP
- The cost \$1.45/day
- Purchase enough to protect yourself during the MSP waiting period - from your first day of arrival plus the next two months
- Example: Arrive in Canada on May 1 + Jun + Jul = MSP waiting period

CONTINUING STUDIES AND LEAP STUDENTS

This is intended for students in a Continuing Studies program or LEAP only.

Upon arrival, you will need to apply for Medical Services Plan (MSP) as it is mandatory in the province of British Columbia (BC) for international students to have medical insurance. Since BC MSP does not begin until 3 months after your arrival, you will need to purchase private insurance for those first 3 months. Once your travel arrangements are made, buy the insurance to begin on your first day in BC, for 3 months. To begin, click on the "Apply for Insurance" icon below.

If you are in a Regular Studies program, please refer to the Returning Regular Studies Students or Early Arrivals pages to purchase your insurance or for more information. Do not purchase insurance from this page.



Langara Student Card

To apply for your student card:

- Take a photo of yourself that meets the photo ID guidelines
- Wait until your first day of class
- Complete the 'Request Student ID Card' form

After submitting the application,

- Receive the QR code (may take up to 2 weeks)
- Once the QR code is available, take it to the Self-Service Station at the entrance of the Library on main campus to print


