FINA 2272: Advanced Print Media II: Serigraphy

#### **Course Description, Prerequisites, Corequisites:**

Students expand on their understanding of serigraphy (screenprinting). The emphasis is on self-directed projects that reflect the student's interests and research into serigraphy as an interdisciplinary process. In consultation with the instructor, students develop and complete studio projects using a variety of techniques.

Prerequisites: FINA 2172 with a minimum "C-" grade.

#### **Learning Outcomes:**

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1) use printmaking processes (primarily but not restricted to serigraphy) to generate a body of work reflecting their individual interests in serigraphy and/or serigraphy combined with other studio art process, and
- 2) discuss their work within the contexts of historical and contemporary printmaking/art, particularly as it might relate to current ideas regarding cultural theory, and technology in the arts.

## **Topics Covered:**

As a final printmaking course at Langara College, the emphasis will be on personal development and interests in printmaking, either as a studio in itself, and/or as interdisciplinary study incorporating other studio areas.

Weeks 1 and 2: Topic/content: The Contemporary Print, Printmakers and Process (presentation and discussion). Practical component: Each student generates a 'Statement of Intent' outlining the scope of projects he/she expects to complete during the term. The statement can be amended as necessary to reflect the student's research and development of projects. It is expected that students will generate and complete two to three projects during the term.

Weeks 3 through 6: Students work on individual projects, using the instructor as a project facilitator and resource for technical assistance. At the end of Week 6, projects will be formally critiqued by the class.

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Weeks 7 through 12: Students continue with projects, which will be formally critiqued at the end of the term.
