In this survey course, students are introduced to recreation facilities operation at arenas, pools, and fitness centers. Students explore a wide range of applied business practices that impact the delivery of recreation services, including human resource management, business analysis, and the legislative and regulatory requirements behind the operation of recreation facilities. Students participate in field trips to various recreation facilities to explore new trends and innovative practices in the field.

Registration in this course is restricted to students admitted to the Bachelor of Recreation Management and the Recreation Leadership Diploma.

- Identify the legislative and regulatory requirements in operating recreation facilities (e.g., arenas, pools, gymnasiums, and fitness centres).

- Summarize best practices in the field in relation to organizational structures, emergencies, and daily maintenance.
- Perform basic statistical analysis to evaluate a recreation facility's performance
- Identify new trends and innovative practices in recreation facility operations
