

Learn English in Vancouver

SUMMER ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAM 2026



Langara.

Located in beautiful Vancouver, British Columbia, Langara College provides programs to more than 14,000 students annually, including close to 3,000 international students. The Summer English Language Program (SELP Program) allows students to improve their English skills and to broaden their cultural understanding through classroom activities, off-campus educational visits, and cultural activities.

PROGRAM DETAILS

THE PROGRAM

The SELP Program is open to students of all language levels.

The program helps students improve their fluency, build confidence, and strengthen their communication skills through different activities such as pair-work, group projects, and educational and socio-cultural outings.

Instructors assess students throughout the program, basing their assessment on participation, achievement, and attendance. At the end of the program, students participate in a closing ceremony when they receive a certificate of completion and graded report card.

Language classes focus on weekly themes:

Week One | English Essentials

A focus on the information, language, and resources that students need during their time in Vancouver.

Week Two | Cultural Studies

An exploration of cultural differences and similarities. Students are introduced to the theories of deep and surface culture and of intercultural communication. They also learn about the importance of non-verbal communication, small talk, and culture shock.

Week Three | English in Social Media

A look at how digital platforms shape the way we communicate and express ourselves. Students explore the language of social media and learn how to share ideas, stories, and opinions in digital spaces.

OFF-CAMPUS EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL OUTINGS

Students also participate in several off-campus activities to learn about Vancouver and interact with local people.



Discover Vancouver

Students are put into small groups and paired with a local student who joins them for a full-day scavenger hunt around Vancouver. Students use various forms of transit to visit different places of interest, speak to local people, and take photos that are used for a class presentation about their experience.

Kayaking

A fun afternoon in Deep Cove, where experienced guides help students learn to kayak, take them on a guided tour, and teach them about local history and wildlife.

While kayaking, students often see seals, eagles, sea stars, and other marine animals. This is a unique opportunity to explore Vancouver from a different perspective: from the water that surrounds it.



Capilano Suspension Bridge

A visit to the famous suspension bridge located high above the Capilano River in North Vancouver. At the park, students walk across the bridge, learn about the coastal rainforest, visit the Story Centre, walk through the Treetop Adventure, take the Cliffwalk, and learn about First Nations people.

Vancouver Aquarium

Students learn about the local marine environment, visit exhibits, experience the 4-D theatre show, and listen to presentations made by aquarium staff while they feed the otters and the sea lions.

Museum of Vancouver

At the museum, students develop an understanding of Vancouver through the stories, objects, and shared experiences presented in the museum's collections and exhibits.



PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

Most afternoons, students work on group projects that may include researching local tourist attractions, comparing and contrasting cultures, or creating a social media post—all designed to help students work collaboratively to explore relevant and engaging topics.

Our experienced instructors are selected not only for their teaching skills, but also for their intercultural awareness and commitment to helping students achieve success.



HOMESTAY
