Course Description

The course will consider how works of speculative and science fiction call on us to examine and reevaluate our perceptions and constructions of gender, sexuality, race, class, ability and disability, and our relationship with the more-than-human world, engaging with queer, Afrofuturist, indigenous, crip, and anti-capitalist perspectives. It will ask students to critically engage with issues of progress, sustainability, inequality, identity, technology, and time. Apart from a variety of essays analyzing the stories and novels in the course, students will also produce a creative response related to the themes and futures of the texts, showcasing their ability to "imagine otherwise" and speculate productively themselves.
