Course Description, Prerequisites, Corequisites:

The individual experience of aging in Canada is shaped by the larger social policies put in place to respond to population aging. In this course, students explore the role of the welfare state, political ideology, and the concept of social determinants of health in relation to issues affecting older adults and their families. Students use this foundation to examine key areas of concern such as elder abuse, caregiving, dementia, retirement income, income inequality, housing, health care, and aging in place. Students analyze current and proposed policy responses to such issues.

Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to...

1. Explain the role of the welfare state and social policy in shaping the lives of older adults, including marginalized older adults (e.g. Indigenous, racialized, LGBTQ2S+, differently-abled, low income)
2. Describe the roles of different levels of government and other actors in Canadian policy development
3. Identify dominant political ideologies in Canada and explain how these ideologies influence the actions taken to address social problems
4. Describe the social determinants of health and explain how they act as underlying factors for the wellbeing of older adults
5. Identify current social issues related to aging in Canada and critique the policy options and approaches meant to address these issues
