Section 1: Overview

(1.1) In accordance with Section 19 (1)(d) of the *College and Institute Act*, authority for determining programs to be offered or cancelled at the institution rests with the College Board.

Section 2: Purpose

(2.1) This policy outlines the considerations and responsibilities for the suspension and/or cancellation of any credentialed, for-credit program at Langara.

Section 3: Definitions

(3.1) In this Policy:

"Act" means the British Columbia College and Institute Act. "Credential" means a named qualification awarded by the College upon successful completion of a prescribed program of study.

"**Program**" means a set of courses or a course of study that leads to a College credential. "**Program Cancellation**" means the permanent closure of a program which includes

removal from the list of program offerings and cessation of admission.

"**Program Suspension**" means a temporary measure that occurs when a program is not offered for one or more intake(s).

Section 4: Governing Principles

(4.1) This policy applies to all for-credit programs that lead to a College credential. It does not apply to courses or non-credentialed programs.

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- (4.2) Proposals to suspend or cancel a program may come from the program area, the Dean, or the Provost and Vice-President, Academic.
- (4.3) Program suspension and cancellation decisions will be made in a respectful, timely and considered manner.
- (4.4) The decision to suspend or cancel a program will be informed by a process of consultation and information gathering with stakeholders, and the careful evaluation of required qualitative and quantitative program indicators.
- (4.5) Should timelines and decisions be pressing, particularly in times of severe financial constraints or other exigencies, the consultation process may be abridged or expedited.
- (4.6) Suspension or cancellation must minimize the impact on current students. A transition plan will be developed to allow students in the program to complete their program within reasonable time limits.





- (4.7) Suspension of a program does not necessarily lead to cancellation.
- (4.8) The College Board will make the final decision to suspend or cancel a for-credit program, after hearing the advice of Education Council.

Section 5: Review Date

(5.1) A review of this Policy should be completed no later than every five years.
