Students will receive credit for only one of ENGL 1129 or 1130.

Prerequisites: One of the following: LET 4 (or LET 3 with a strong recommendation of concurrent registration in ENGL 1121); a minimum 70% in English First Peoples 12, English Studies 12, Literary Studies 12, or equivalent; a minimum "C" grade in ENGL 1120; an "S" grade in ENGL 1107, 1108, or 1110; or a minimum "C" grade in 3 credits of any university-transferrable ENGL course.

- discuss literature, poetry, and film using a variety of discipline-specific terms
- make stylistic connections between different types of genres (poems, novels, films)
- write, draft, revise, and format an analytical/argument essay

- demonstrate critical and creative thinking in class discussion and written work
