Projects include capturing a still-life or portrait on film, processing it, and creating a silver gelatin print and creating a print using an enlarged digital negative and a historic process such as cyanotype, Van Dyke Brown, salted paper or platinum/palladium. Students who have received credit for PHOT 1151 will not receive credit for this course and may be dropped.

Prerequisites: A minimum "C" grade in PHOT 1100 or 1105; or permission of the department.

- Coat, expose and process a print using a historic process.
- Re-create and capture an image featured in AHIS 1219 course.
- Process black and white film.
- Create a silver gelatin print.
